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THE PROPHETIC LANGUAGE OF NATIONAL JUDGMENT

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INTRODUCTION: Prophetic language

In the following pages, it is my intention to discuss and outline the various types of prophetic language used by Isaiah to describe national judgment. It should be noted that the prophet of God is one who has a message to proclaim from God. Thus the language in which this message is expressed is of the nature to communicate in word pictures the necessity of heeding the word of God. The prophet's mouth was God's mouth speaking (Is. 6:8 cf Amos 6; Acts 4:20; 5:29).

The prophet's mission was to speak to his own generation of judgment and salvation concerning the religious, political, and social corruption.

Judgment:

Refusal to repent brings about national judgment. This judgment upon a nation is seen in the prophetic language of Isaiah in many aspects. It is the ruin and loss of one's own community, the collapse of the governmental structure, and the end of the nation as a recognized political entity of people.

Judgment comes upon the unrighteous nation when its iniquity becomes so great that there is not remaining in it enough righteous individuals to preserve it from the wrath of God.

NATIONAL JUDGMENT:

There are a number of methods Isaiah used in preaching the message of God to the people of his day. There are also a number of Messianic applications to some of the passages. However, I will limit this paper only to the figure used to express the judgments pronounced by Jehovah God.

A. LITERAL STATEMENTS OF JUDGMENT

There are a number of statements and phrases used by Isaiah but perhaps the most dynamic are the literal and out-right statements denoting judgment.

- DESTRUCTION: Waste, ruin, spoiling, breaking, to cut off
 - a. 10:18 "And He will destroy...both soul and body"
 - b. 10:23 "For a complete destruction...the Lord God of hosts will execute"

The most recognizible statement used through prophetic language is that declaring the activity of God. We must always remember that judgment is from the Righteous God who rules the nations and universe. It is God Who controls and sustains all and this is why His activity is expressed words of action.

D. NATURE AS IN JUDGMENT

Many times today man expresses his feelings and experiences in terms of nature. It is in like manner that Isaiah used the familiar things of nature to proclaim his message of judgment to give the effect needed to bring about repentance and salvation. It is significant to note that Isaiah used the figure of fire more than any other form to express judgment and destruction.

People are an important part of the prophetic message of national judgment. It is this judgment that would affect the lives of the people of the nations. Thus people are used to express the cause and effect of judgment.

The designation of the "day" in the judgment of nations declares the nearness and swiftness of judgment. It shows the point in time when judgment will take place.

a. 2:12 - "For the Lord of hosts will have a day of reckoning

Against everyone who is proud and lofty"

3. IN THAT DAY:

4. DAY OF PUNISHMENT:

J. DESCRIPTION OF GOD AS IN JUDGMENT:

In any study of judgment, always take note that Jehovah God is the focal point. It is because of what God is that judgment is expressed in such graphic terms. God wants man to be righteous and redeemed.

1. LORD CAME OUT OF HIS PLACE:

- a. 26:21 "For behold, the Lord is about to come out of His place to punish the inhabitants of the earth..."
- b. 30:27 "Behold the name of the Lord comes from a remote place..."

2. TERROR OF THE LORD:

- a. 2:10 "...hide...from the terror of the Lord and from the splender of His majesty."
- b. 2:21 "Before the terror of the Lord and the splendor of his majesty"

EXALTATION OF THE LORD:

- a. 2:11 "And the Lord alone will be exalted in that day."
- b. 2:17 same
- c. 5:16 "But the Lord of hosts will be exalted in judgment"

WRATH - INDIGNATION - ANGER:

- a. 10:25 "For in a very little while My indignation against you will be spent, and My anger will be directed to their destruction."
- b. 13:5 "The Lord and His instruments of indignation..."
- c. 13:13 In the day of His burning anger
- d. 26:20 "Hide for a little while, Until indignation runs its course."
- e. 30:27 "His lips are filled with indignation

 And His tongue is like a consuming fire."

K. SHEOL AS IN JUDGMENT:

Sheol is descriptive of the finality of judgment. It is the end of a nation and descriptive of the awesomeness of not heeding the prophet's preaching of God's message.

- 2. 14:19 But you have been cast out of your tomb
- 3. 14:15 "You will be thrust down to Sheol"

L. MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS AS IN JUDGMENT:

To cover all the bases in his preaching, the prophet graphically declares national judgment in many common forms for illustration purposes. In addition to the above examples, there are a number of miscellaneous forms used throughout the book of Isaiah.

- 1. NOAH:
 - a. 54:9 -"For this is like the days of Noah to me"
- 2. SODOM AND GOMORRAH:
 - a. 1:9 "Unless the Lord of Hosts had left us a few survivors We would be like Sodom...and Gomorrah."
 - b. 3.9 "And they display their sin like Sodom"
 - c. 33:12 "And the peoples will be burned to lime"
 - d. 34:9 "And its streams shall be turned into pitch And its loose earth into brimstone And its land shall become burning pitch."
- FORMER THINGS:

- 4. PEG:
 - a. 22:25 "The peg driven in a firm place will give way..."

5. WORLD:

- a. 13:11 "Thus I will punish the world for its evil...:
- b. 24:4 "The earth mourns, and withers, the world fades and withers..."

6. BRIDLE:

- a. 30:28 ",...the bridle which leads to ruin."
- b. 37:29 "Therefore, I will put...My bridle in your lips."

7. READINESS AND SWIFTNESS:

- c. 8:1 "Swift is the booty; speedy is the prey."

8. WHISTLE:

SHAVE WITH RAZOR:

a. 7:20 - "In that day the Lord will shave with a razor, the head and the hair of the legs; and it will also remove the beard."

10. POTTER AND CLAY:

a. 64:8 - "All of us are the work of Thy hand."

11. WICK:

a. 43:17 - "They have been quenched and extinguiahed like a wick."

SUMMARY:

As has been outlined in this report, prophetic language of national judgment is graphically presented by the prophet Isaiah to bring the **pp**ople back to Jehovah God and gain salvation from the impending judgment.

Through Isaiah there is depicted the seriousness of the message with the evident doom picture portrayed for nations. However, just as prophetic language describes national judgment, there is always the ray of hope to the righteous of redemption!

Then, you will say on that day, I will give thanks to Thee, O Lord; For although Thou wast angry with me, Thine anger is turned away, And thou does comfort me. "Behold, God is my salvation, I will trust and not be afraid; For the Lord God is my strength and song And He has become my salvation." Therefore you will joyously draw water From the springs of salvation. And in that day you will say, "Give thanks to the Lord, call on His name. Make known His deeds among the peoples; Make them remember that His name is exalted." Praise the Lord in song, for He has done excellent things: Let this be known throughout the earth. Cry aloud and shout for joy, O inhabitants of Zion, For great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.
